## Dear President Collins:

Thank you for the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston's (the Boston Fed) April 10 report, *Small and Medium-sized Businesses' Expectations Concerning Tariffs, Costs, and Prices* (Current Policy Perspectives No. 25-7). This type of analysis helps us make better policy for Main Street, especially on quickly evolving issues like our current tariff policies. Much of the existing data available on the impact of tariffs on small businesses is anecdotal. As such, the Massachusetts delegation would be grateful if the Boston Fed could conduct follow-up surveys on the impact of tariffs on small businesses, including crosstabulations showing the expected and realized impacts of tariffs on small businesses broken down by industry, importer status, and firm size.<sup>2</sup>

Recent tariff actions announced by President Trump, including a proposed 10 percent across-the-board tariff and higher, targeted rates on certain trading partners, are already causing hardship in our communities. Small firms across Massachusetts tell us they face rising input costs and price uncertainty, and they question how much of those costs they can pass on to customers without losing sales.<sup>3</sup> National reporting indicates that U.S. businesses are bracing for broader supply chain disruption as these measures roll out.<sup>4</sup> Federal Reserve Beige Book reporting similarly points to tariff-related price pressures emerging in several regions, including the Boston District.<sup>5</sup>

To help us support small businesses navigating the evolving tariff environment, we would welcome any data and collaboration you can provide. Specifically, we would be grateful if you are able to provide:

1. Follow-up surveys on the impacts of tariffs on small businesses;

- 2. Crosstabulations of the data by industry, importer status, and firm size;
- 3. A breakdown of New England and, if the sample allows, Massachusetts-specific data;
- 4. Data around whether tariff-related cost pressure has impacted hiring plans, hours, or wages;
- 5. Data around whether tariff-related cost pressure has impacted growth and investment plans for small businesses, including consideration or actions towards closure; and
- 6. Data around whether tariff-related cost pressure has increased costs for consumers.

We look forward to working with you to ensure that evidence from New England's small businesses informs federal policymaking in ways that support sustainable, broad-based growth.

Thank you again for your leadership and for the Boston Fed's continued service to our region and the nation.
