## A BILL

To provide grants to owners of grandfamily housing, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

**3 SECTION 1. GRANT PROGRAM FOR GRANDFAMILY HOUS-**

ING.

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- 5 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—
- 6 (1) the term "grandfamily housing" means a 7 dwelling unit dedicated to low-income—

8 (A) grandparents caring full-time for a
9 grandchild; or

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1	(B) older relative caregivers caring full-
2	time for a relative child;
3	(2) the term "grandfamily resident service coor-
4	dinator" means an individual who—
5	(A) is employed or contracted by an owner
6	of grandfamily housing;
7	(B) assists grandparents and older relative
8	caregivers with the process of applying to and
9	moving into the grandfamily housing; and
10	(C) regularly—
11	(i) assesses the needs of the residents,
12	on a collective and family basis, of the
13	grandfamily housing; and
14	(ii) plans and executes grandfamily
15	housing programming services based on
16	the assessment described in clause (i);
17	(3) the term "low-income" means income that
18	does not exceed 80 percent of the area median gross
19	income;
20	(4) the term "owner of grandfamily housing"
21	means a nonprofit or for-profit entity that develops,
22	owns, or operates grandfamily housing; and
23	(5) the term "Secretary" means the Secretary
24	of Housing and Urban Development.

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(b) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary shall establish
 a program to provide grants to owners of grandfamily
 housing for grandfamily resident service coordinators to
 support housing programming services, equipment, and
 building structures of grandfamily housing.

6 (c) USE OF FUNDS.—A recipient of amounts under
7 this section may use any amounts provided to—

8 (1) employ a grandfamily resident service coor-9 dinator,

10 (2) finance the planning and provision of serv11 ices designed for grandparent and older relative
12 caregivers;

(3) finance construction and upkeep of spaces
within permanent building structures of grandfamily
housing and communal areas used for programing
and services designed for grandparent and older relative caregivers; and

18 (4) facilitate outreach required under sub-19 section (d).

20 (d) Outreach.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Any recipient of amounts
under this section shall engage with grandparent
and older relative caregivers in the community surrounding the property that contains the grandfamily
housing owned by the grant recipient by—

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1	(A) performing periodic informational out-
2	reach; and
3	(B) holding periodic events, including in-
4	tergenerational events.
5	(2) Special focus.—When undertaking out-
6	reach and events pursuant to paragraph (1), a grant
7	recipient shall place special focus on grandparents
8	and older relative caregivers that reside in a unit—
9	(A) that is part of a housing project for
10	which assistance is provided by the public hous-
11	ing program under the United States Housing
12	Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C. 1437 et seq.);
13	(B) that is part of the program for sup-
14	portive housing for the elderly under section
15	202 of the Housing Act of $1959$ (12 U.S.C.
16	1701q); or
17	(C) for which assistance is provided by the
18	program for rental assistance under section 8 of
19	the United States Housing Act of $1937$ (42)
20	U.S.C. 1437f).
21	(3) COORDINATION.—Outreach and events un-
22	dertaken pursuant to paragraph $(1)$ shall, where
23	possible, be in coordination with a local kinship navi-
24	gator program (as described in section $474(a)(7)$ of

1 the Social Security Act) or a comparable program or

2 entity in the State.

3 (e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
4 are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary to carry
5 out this section \$50,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2020
6 and 2021.
