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SEC. 2. CLARIFICATION HHS HAS AUTHORITY FOR RESI DENTIAL EVICTION MORATORIA. Section 361 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 264) is amended— (1) by redesignating subsection (e) as sub-

6 section (f); and

7 (2) by inserting after subsection (d) the fol-8 lowing:

9 "(e) Consistent with the standard described in sub10 section (a), regulations under this section may implement,
11 maintain, or extend a residential eviction moratorium.".

12 SEC. 3. COVID-19 EVICTION MORATORIUM.

13 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall implement a national residential 14 eviction moratorium under section 361 of the Public 15 Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 264) to reduce the intro-16 17 duction, transmission, and spread of COVID-19 and otherwise address the public health emergency declared under 18 19 section 319 of the such Act (42 U.S.C. 247d) with respect 20 to COVID-19.

21 (b) APPLICABILITY.—The moratorium under sub-22 section (a) shall—

(1) be automatic, without requiring individualsto apply for coverage; and

25 (2) apply to all residential eviction filings, hear26 ings, judgments, and execution of judgments, except

that the Secretary of Health and Human Services
 may establish moratorium exceptions necessary to
 protect the health and safety of others.

4 (c) PERIOD FOLLOWING PUBLIC HEALTH EMER5 GENCY.—The moratorium under subsection (a) shall re6 main in effect at least 60 days after the conclusion of the
7 public health emergency described in such subsection, in8 cluding any extensions thereof.
